

Tax rate for imported solar container battery cabinets in Croatia

In addition to the described calculation of customs duties, value added tax (VAT) will be calculated depending on the rate prescribed for a particular type of goods.

In addition to customs duties, imported goods are also subject to Value Added Tax (VAT). The VAT rate is 25% and is calculated based on the goods' CIF value and customs duty amount.

In Croatia, the standard VAT rate is 25%. However, certain goods and services are subject to reduced rates of 13% and 15%, while others are exempt or subject to a 0% VAT rate.

The VAT base of imports is the customs value as prescribed by customs regulations, increased by customs duties, import duties, special taxes, and other fees paid during customs clearing.
